CHRONOLOGICAL NARRATIVE
OPERATIONS
SEPTEMBER 1945

During the month of September most of the 3rd Bombardment Group (L) flying consisted of moving planes from Okinawa to Japan, both A-20s and A-26s. Several local flights were conducted at Okinawa and Japan and a few reconnaissances, patrol and survey flights were conducted during the latter half of the month. These reconnaissance missions are to be flown daily and generally consist of eight A-26s covering four general sectors of central and northern Honshu.

At the beginning of the month the Group had a total of 51 A-20s and 22 A-26s with 65 A-20 crews and 40 A-26 crews. At the end of September the Group had a total of 25 A-20s, 62 A-26s and 2 B-25s. At this time there were 42 A-20 crews and 42 A-26 crews.

The first Group A-26s to fly to Atsugi, Japan were led by Colonel Charles W. Howe and arrived on August 30. The remainder of the A-26s reached Atsugi by September 8.

Several local flights at Okinawa were conducted on the 1st, 3rd, 5th and 6th of September by all four squadrons A-20s in preparation for their flight to Japan. On September 8th the main air echelon composed of 39 A-20s and 7 A-26s arrived at Atsugi, all planes alanding safely.

Between September 6th and 10th the Group A-20s and A-26s were flown to Chofu Strip, near the new camp area. However, starting on 19 September the planes were moved back to Atsugi, which was finally designated as the base from which the 3rd Group would conduct all its future operations in the capacity of an occupation air group.

On 21 September 20 A-26s, acquired from the 319th Bombardment Group, departed from Machinato Strip, Okinawa and arrived safely at Atsui. On 24 September 22 A-26s, also acquired from the 319th Bomb Group, arrived safely at Atsugi.

Four reconnaissance flights were conducted over northern and central Honshu on 27, 28, 29 and 30 September (FFO #259 - 5th Air Force Teletype). The area over which

these missions were flown was divided up into four main sectors, two planes covering each sector daily. The sectors are divided as follows: Lines of communication and airfield activity from; 1. Hamamatsu to Tsuruga to Aomi to Atsugi, central Honshu, 2. Hamamatsu to Aomi to Sanjo to Atsugi, central Honshu, 3. Atsugi to Sanjo to 40 degrees north covering western half of northern Honshu and 4. Atsugi to 40 degrees north covering eastern half of northern Honshu. 32 A-26 sorties were conducted during these four reconnaissance flights with no unusual sightings. On 30 September 4 A-26s also went out on a survey and patrol mission with no unusual observations being reported.

Colonel Howe, Major MacLellan and Major Kline made several administrative flights between Atsugi and Bolo Strips, Okinawa during the course of the month. Chadwick Jr. (L-5) was kept busy hopping between Bolo Strip and V Bomber Command on northern Okinawa. The two B-25 "Fat Cats" were busy shuttling between Okinawa and Atsugi carrying supplies and equipment.

By the end of September the Group was fully equipped with A-26s, so higher headquarters have taken steps to rid us of our old and war weary A-20s.

The 3rd Bombardment Group (L) was stationed at Okinawa, APO #337, and Honshu, Japan, APO #328, during the month of September 1945. The first advance echelon of A-26s left Okinawa on August 1945, landing at Atsugi Strip, Japan the same day. The A-26 air echelon moved to Chofu Strip, Japan on 6 September and was joined there by the air echelon of A-20s on 9 September. Meanwhile, the water echelon remained in Sobe, Okinawa during the entire month. On 19 September the Group moved back to Atsugi again.

LOCAL INTEREST

The first Group A-26s landed at Atsugi Strip, Japan on 30 August. We were the first bomber group to be stationed in Japan, and therefore flew our airplanes north from Okinawa as soon as possible. When the first A-26s landed there was a conglomeration of aircraft on the field: a few fighters, several "Fat Cat" B-24s and B-25s, and C-46s, C-47s and C-54s of the ATC. Our A-26s did not carry any bombs but all the machine guns were loaded and ready for any possible trouble. The first few days all crews slept near their planes, food consisted of 10 in 1 rations and all available blankets were used. Nothing unusual occurred during this short period, but the planes were kept ready for an emergency.

Between 6 - 9 September all 3rd Group planes were moved up to Chofu Strip, about 20 miles north of Atsugi. Most of the A-20s arrived at Atsugi from Okinawa on 8 September, and these flew to Chofu on the 9th. At this time Chofu was expected to be the home of the 3rd Group during its stay in Japan, so work was begun immediately on cleaning up the area. All buildings were given a liberal dose of DDT, trash and debris were cleared from the area, showers were set up with steam heat and naturally everyone kept an eye open for souvenirs. Chofu has a relatively short field but only one mishap occurred when a landing gear collapsed. With the exception of a few couriers there was very little flying from Chofu because of the shortage of gas. However, some of the pilots found a Japanese PT or BT near the field and took it up on a few short flights. This soon stopped when the engine began acting up. The food situation was still pretty bad with the main fare being C rations.

After spending about ten days at Chofu the 3rd Group was ordered back to Atsugi on 19 September, this time we hoped it was final. Once again barracks had to be thoroughly cleaned out, trash disposed of, mess halls rebuilt and steam piped in for showers. As before everyone pitched in and really went to work in order to make as nice a home as possible. Several caves were filled in so that no one would fall in one and hurt themselves. Japanese labor details were put to work and with a little supervision have been doing a good job.

The barracks we live in now are by far the best living conditions the Group has had during its more than 3½ years overseas. Nice mess halls, inside movies, inside latrines, hot water showers, etc. make this a pretty "Fat Cat" life. Probably the best feature for the old-timers is that we no longer live in a tent filled with mud, or have a river running through the middle of the tent, or even have any leaks in the roofs above our heads. There are several are several buildings that will soon be used as Headquarters offices, Supply, Engineering, Intelligence, Medics and Photo Lab. but work is still being done on these future offices. Operations is down on the line and after a little more work will be a very satisfactory set-up. In this same building all parachutes will be kept, the Operations Officers will have offices, Intelligence will keep their maps and Communications will have the necessary radio equipment.

Because of the water echelon still being in Okinawa there is a severe shortage of vehicles. However, by only making necessary trips everything worked out all right. Transportation would always be found to go out after a beer ration. This Japanese beer is quite a favorite among all personnel.

Atsugi Strip was not in too good condition, that is the taxiways and parking areas had deep holes or the ground was too soft in places. As a result a few accidents were sustained while taxing. However, construction men are continually working on this problem. Now that the war is over flying regulations began to stiffen a bit. At first our low level flying A-26s and A-20s could buzz as much as they liked, mainly to show off our superior air power. Later though, for safety sake, there was to be no flying below 1000feet, except of course in landing or taking off. This was mainly due to high wires strung all over the Japanese countryside and the numerous mountains that covered much of Honshu.

Without a doubt the best news many 3rd Group men heard in September was that they were going home, or at least getting ready to go. Quite a few men had well over 100 discharge points, which was more than enough. These men have served long and faithfully in the various departments of the "Grim Reapers", and those of us who were left behind realized that they had done more than their part and wished them all the luck in the world. Some men were

to go to the 312th Bombardment Group and others to the 380th Bombardment Group, both of which were being sent back to the States.

This is the real story straight from the Adjutants office on 3rd Group men going home. On about 22 August we redeployed the first batch, 138 non-combat enlisted men with 85 or more points as of 12 May 1945. On about 25 August 25 combat enlisted men with 85 or more points were sent to the 22nd Replacement Depot. On 20 September 204 enlisted men and 46 officers were assigned to Headquarters, 312th Bomb Group, Officers having 85 or more points and enlisted men having 80 or more points as of 2 September.

Now for some tragic news. On 6 September 2nd Lt. Stanley R. Olmstead, and S/Sgts. Francis P. Korth and George M. Holtsinger Jr. of the 13th Squadron were killed instantly when their A-20 just left a routine formation flight and plunged into the water.

About a week later four 89th Squadron enlisted men; Sgt. Robert E. Young and Cpls. George P. Hummel, Fred H. Johnson and Charles E. Stoy, were lost when the C-46 they were flying in from Okinawa to Japan crashed some place enroute. (Nakayama, Japan). 317th TC Plane.

A few days later 2nd Lt. Wendell J. Owens of the 89th Squadron was killed in a street accident in the Tokyo area. Lt. Owens was one of the hardest working and best liked men of the 89th.

The rear echelon at Okinawa had a pretty tough time after the air echelon left on 8 September. No one knew anything about how or when they'd leave, there was still plenty work to be done and men were continually leaving to go home. Some of the Group records and equipment were loaded onto Liberty ships. Then came the first typhoon on the night of 16-17 September. About 60% of the tents were blown down and much equipment was either lost or soaking wet by morning. Luckily enough no personnel were injured.

The Intelligence Department had its headache during this time as it was occupied with a unit history to be written from the date of activation to March 1944. This was a very difficult task as there was a shortage of personnel and a dearth of material from which to compile it.

This was in the face of a directive which, after at least a year of avoiding the subject, required its submission by 1 November.

There was a presentation Ceremony at the 312th Bomb Group on the afternoon of 21 September. Brigadier General Jarred V. Crabb, Commanding V Bomber Command presented decorations to personnel of this Group as follows:

S/Sgt. James F. Lynch received the Silver Star; Captain Douglas B. Hughmanick, 1st Lt. William H. Bennett, 1st Lt. Ernest R. Jackson, 1st Lt. Jack D. Jurmo, 1st Lt. Marion P. Wilson; S/Sgt. Samuel D. Hagenbush Jr., S/Sgt. James M. Ptolomey, S/Sgt. Fred R. Schaeffer, and S/Sgt. Joe W. Watkins received the Air Medal.

By 24 September the 3rd Attack Group's total aircraft in the Tokyo Area was 90 --- 64 A-26s and 26 A-20s. Over 200 of the Groups personnel were in Japan by this date.

Plans have already been made about a new consolidated set-up for the Group in Japan. There are going to be separate squadron orderly rooms, but the main work will be done in the Headquarters orderly room. There is going to be one Motor Pool, one Operations set-up, one Intelligence office, one supply section, etc. Now that the war is over we're all sure this will be a much better system resulting in a greater efficiency while using less personnel.


